## BYLAW COMMITTEE

The Bylaw Committee has taken on the significant task of revising the RLCA bylaws so they comply with the Washington Uniform Common Interest Ownership Act (WUCIOA), the mediated settlement, and the Easement Agreement with the Water Association.

Since August 2025, this committee of ten members has met monthly to work on this effort. Between meetings, small subcommittees research WUCIOA, the mediated settlement, and the easement agreement, and draft proposed bylaw revisions to ensure compliance.

Each draft bylaw prepared by these subcommittees is reviewed, questioned, and discussed by the full committee not just once, but twice at two separate meetings. After that review, the proposed bylaw is forwarded to the RLCA Board, where it is also read, questioned, and discussed at two separate meetings before it is considered ready to share with the community.

We hope to move into the adoption phase of this process this summer. In order for the bylaws to be adopted, the consent of the members of the Reflection Lake Community will be required.

## Conservation, Maintenance & Dams (CMD) Committee Update:

The committee continues to make progress on several lake and grounds projects. Volunteers were recognized for their outstanding work refurbishing the Reflection Lake sign, contributing an estimated 300–500 hours of service.

Maintenance plans for this year include repairing cracks in the spillway as recommended by the Department of Ecology, replacing the south outlet measuring tape, refinishing two benches, updating signage, and replacing the gate lock after last year's attempted tampering.

The committee is also beginning the process of obtaining three written bids and working with an engineer for the planned valve replacement. Ongoing discussions include fish management in the lake, the possible stocking of trout later this year, and collaboration with Gonzaga University researchers, who will present their plant and fish studies to the community on May 2, during the BBQ following our Lake Clean Up. Finally, the number one project is installing our new dock and building a new ramp on Bings Landing.
